

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

Rationale

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.

Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:-

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- promotes a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- is practical and smart
- identifies the children with the school
- prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents
- is designed with health and safety in mind

Our uniform consists of:-

- navy sweatshirt for pupils in Nursery up to Year 11 - *(with school logo if desired)*
- black sweatshirt for pupils in Years 12 to 14 – *(with school logo if desired)*
- polo shirts - white
- trousers/skirt/pinafore – grey/black
- summer dress – blue and white check
- swimming costume/trunks *(no specific colour)*
- PE kit (no specific colour)

Please mark all clothing with your child's name – any lost property can be located at the school office where unidentified items are placed on a regular basis.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. We ask the children to either remove these objects during PE and games, or cover them with a plaster (provided by the parent), to prevent them from causing injury.

Footwear

We require all children to wear dark shoes, no trainers, no heels. School are aware that some children may require specially made shoes or adaptations which are an obvious exception to this rule.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily school work. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the headteacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will consider such requests.
